## VIEW FROM THE VICE...

How hard can it be to decorate a boat for the Christmas parade? You just buy some cheap Wal-Mart lights, run them to the top of the mast and plug them in. Voila, a decorated boat!

As simple as that may sound, you realize that one strand of lights going from the deck to the top of the mast isn't very decorative. Two strands still don't do it and even three or four is just a start. Eleven strings of lights later, you are closer but not quite there yet. Those light don't just land there themselves. You have to secure them to something so that you can hoist them up and down. Some light line works well, but then again, you will need about 600 feet to do the job properly. Tie wrap the strings of lights onto the light line with about one wrap every two feet. Then pull it tight and snip off the end. About 300 tie wraps, 300 pulls, and 300 hundred snips later, you are well on your way to having your boat look presentable at the parade.

I laid the lines from inside the garage to the end of the driveway. Laid out the lines and then attached the lights to them, pulling and snipping every two feet until the job was complete. Two full set of lights representing the headsail and the main sail. On the driveway they looked great. All one color - blue - with every light shouting "Merry Christmas!" I was so proud of myself until I realized that somehow I was going to have to get these lights off the driveway and up the mast.

Now, you all know what a mess it is every year when you pull out the strings of lights and they are all tangled with one another. Well, add 600 feet of line and all those pulls and snips and everything just tangles up like a rat's nest. I rolled them all up and off to the boat I went with more optimism than common sense. Once I was at the boat, I attempted to pull just the headsail set of lights up with the spinnaker halyard to see what would happen. To no one's surprise, they all tangled up in one great big mess. An hour later, I was able to untangle the mess and they were all in place. The main sail was in just about the same mess, except this time I had some experience and it only took about forty-five minutes.

Now somehow I had to get all the plugs together and put some power to this masterpiece. Five extension cords and two power strips later, I felt like Clark Griswold on Christmas Eve - lots of lights, but no power. A wiggle here and a wiggle there and finally


