
On Saturday, we had over 100 people attend, with the majority coming in the morning. For better results in the future, we should all try to be rigged and ready to sail at 11 am sharp.

## Exceptional Recipe's



The recipe's below were served at our Holiday Potluck. Many members requested the recipe's—so here they are for all to enjoy!

### **Kelly's Delicious Graham Squares**

Butter a jellyroll pan (10" x 15")  
Line the pan with graham cracker squares.  
In saucepan, melt together 2 sticks butter and 1 cup dark brown sugar.  
Add 1 teaspoon Vanilla.  
Turn to medium high heat, bring to rolling boil, and let boil about 1 minute.  
Pour over the graham crackers to cover all.  
Sprinkle with roasted chopped pecans.  
Bake at 350 degrees for about 10 minutes (the will be bubbly while cooking).  
Remove from oven and sprinkle with milk chocolate chips (Kelly prefers Ghiradelli)  
Cook 5 minutes, then cut into squares and put on racks to cool.

### **Pumpkin Gingerbread Trifle**

2 (14-ounce) packages gingerbread mix  
1 (5.1-ounce) package cook and server vanilla pudding mix  
1 (20-ounce) can pumpkin pie filling  
1/2 cup packed dark brown sugar  
1/3 teaspoon ground cinnamon  
2 pinch ground cardamom  
1/4 cup sherry (optional)  
1 (12-ounce) container frozen whipped topping  
1/2 cup crushed gingersnap cookies  
Large Decorative Bowl

Preheat oven and bake gingerbread according to the package; turn out onto a rack and let cool completely.

While gingerbread is baking, cook the vanilla pudding; set aside and let cool. When pudding is cool, stir in the pie filling, brown sugar, cinnamon, and cardamom.

Crumble the cooled gingerbread into pieces (about 1/4 inch; but not too finely).

(If you have a trifle bowl, wonderful—otherwise you can use another large decorative bowl or punchbowl to assemble the trifle in).

Put half of the crumbled gingerbread in the bottom of the bowl, sprinkle with half of the sherry (if using), then pour half of the pudding mixture over it, and then half of the whipped topping. Repeat the layers with the remaining ingredients as above, then sprinkle the crushed gingersnaps over the top (2 or 2 tablespoons chopped pecans would make a good addition to the topping, as well).

Cover with plastic wrap and chill overnight in the refrigerator. Makes 20 servings.
